## International research funding opportunities

The NIHR Health Technology Assessment Programme in the UK has a long-standing collaboration with the Australian NHMRC and advertise joint commissioned calls inviting collaborative international research proposals to address shared research priorities. These collaborative commissioned calls are announced on

the <u>NIHR</u> and funding <u>NHMRC</u> websites. There is also opportunity to <u>suggest research</u> <u>topics</u> that could go through the NIHR prioritisation process for future funding consideration. Joint funding applications between the UK and Australia may be one way to provide opportunity and solidify international relationships in primary health care research.

Please contact the Secretariat if you have a research idea and we can put you in touch with the Society for Academic Primary Care (SAPC) in the UK who will assist with facilitating collaboration with NIHR.

## Australian primary care specific funding opportunities

A few primary care relevant grant opportunities that may be of interest for you or your team members:

- **Clinical Trials Activity** grant opportunity with Primary care specific opportunities in streams 5 and 6. Applications close 6 July, 2022.
- Preventive and Public Health Research Initiatives: Maternal Health and
   Healthy Lifestyles Grant, Consumer-Led Research Grant, and Chronic Respiratory
   Conditions (stream 2). All Opened 20 December. 2021, and close 13 July, 2022.
- Primary Health Care Digital Innovations grant to develop novel digital health tools and technologies to improve access to primary health care services in disadvantaged and/or vulnerable populations. Applications close on 22 July, 2022.
- MRFF Effective Treatments and Therapies grant opportunity (Focus on exercise and physical activity interventions). Applications close 27 July, 2022.
- MRFF Dementia, Ageing and Aged Care grant to support older people to maintain their health and quality of life (particularly streams 1 and 2). Applications close 7 September, 2022.
- MRFF Cardiovascular Health grant opportunity (particularly stream 3).
  Applications close 7 September, 2022.

To receive personalised research grant updates, make sure to input your research key words (separated by commas) when you register!
