#### Plenary Speaker: Professor Claire Jackson (AM)

Professor Claire Jackson (AM) is Professor in General Practice and Primary Care Research, and Director of the Centre for Health System Reform and Integration, University of Queensland. Professor Jackson has been Clinical Director of two \$2.5 million Centres for Research Excellence in Primary Care Reform: one funded by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC), exploring new models of integrating care in hospital and the community; the other by the Australian Primary Health Care Research Institute (APHCRI), investigating the impact of researcher and end-user 'co-creation' on



quality and models of care. Professor Jackson is a Non-Executive Director of the Hospitals Contribution Fund of Australia Ltd (HCF), Australia's largest NFP private health insurer, and Chair of the HCF Research Foundation. She is a NED on the Brisbane South Primary Health Network, and a member of the Editorial Advisory Committee of the Medical Journal of Australia. She is a current member of Minister Hunt's Primary Care Reform Steering Committee, and has been both a past Chair and President of the Royal Australian College of General Practitioners. She is an active clinician in Brisbane south.

Professor Jackson will be speaking on her primary area of research interest: health system reform, with a focus on primary care.

# Upcoming ECR Webinar 19th April, 1pm (AEST)

<u>Dr Olayide Ogunsiji</u> will be presenting a webinar on navigating academia on the **19th of April**, **1pm AEST**. Dr Ogunsiji is a Registered Nurse and Senior lecturer at the School of Nursing and Midwifery, Western Sydney University, Australia. She is the Director of Academic Workforce (Liverpool campus).



Originally from Nigeria, Olayide migrated to Australia in1999, with a Master of Science (Sociology) and embarked on the Nursing journey in Australia. She is passionate about women's health issues and her research interest are on intimate partner violence, female genital mutilation, parenting and women empowerment. She has made a sustained, positive impact on global health disparity of migrant and refugee women. Olayide is the founder of the African Women's Health and Support Organisation (AWHASO), a not-for-profit organization for women's health issues. She has presented at local, national and international conferences and publishes in high impact journals. Dr Ogunsiji was the recipient of the prestigious Dorothy Garrigus Adams 2021 Award for Excellence in Service at the Sigma Theta Tau International Honour Awards Ceremony.

A quick update from the subcommittee chairs about what they have been working on:



Research, Policy & Advocacy subcommittee submitted a letter to the MRFF on National Practice Based Research Networks. In the letter, AAAPC are advocating for sustainable and ongoing funding that would support national level infrastructure and governance, while also supporting ground up development opportunities for local PBRNs. The subcommittee is currently working on a letter to Australian politicians on the importance of primary care research, and key aspects of the Australian primary care 10 year plan that must be addressed during and after the election. The subcommittee is excited to be working with new contributors from New Zealand.

Conference subcommittee has launched the abstract call and will be dividing up abstracts for review end of April. Subcommittee members are undertaking training with conference software to ensure a smooth experience leading up to and during the conference.  Clinical Trials Activity grant opportunity with Primary care specific opportunities in streams 5 and 6. Applications close 6 July, 2022.

- Preventive and Public Health Research Initiatives: Maternal Health and
  Healthy Lifestyles Grant, Consumer-Led Research Grant, and Chronic Respiratory
  Conditions (stream 2). All Opened 20 December. 2021, and close 13 July, 2022.
