

#### **AAAPC Subcommittee Updates**



AAAPC has 5 subcommittees dedicated to advancing the AAAPC strategic goals and building excellence in academic primary care. New subcommittee chairs were elected for 2022/23 at the AAAPC AGM on 17<sup>th</sup> of August.

**Early Career Researcher subcommittee** is revitalising the Friends Advancing Careers via E-based Support (FACES) group! If you are a member, please check your inbox for a survey that will help direct the group activities for 2023. ECR subcommittee is also celebrating their fantastic webinar from November 24 on peer reviewing and editorial processes.

**Education subcommittee** is advocating for primary care education to be incorporated into all aspects of AAAPC. The subcommittee is committed to supporting education research by working with the conference subcommittee on education focused streams and activities, working with the ECR subcommittee to ensure appropriate early career support for education and teaching, and working with the executive committee to support member opportunities in education, such as the travelling fellowship.

**Membership Engagement subcommittee** is busy expanding AAAPC connections by engaging with primary care organisations in Australia and New Zealand. The subcommittee is working on a strategy to increase engagement in New Zealand, ensure value for members, and expand AAAPC influence.

**Conference subcommittee** has decided on a face-to-face conference event at the university of Melbourne for 2023. The conference will partner with a digital support company to ensure seamless abstract submission, programming and communication throughout the event. The conference subcommittee is working on forward planning by connecting with new sponsors and venues that can support face-to-face conferences in 2024 and beyond.

**Academic Policy & Advocacy subcommittee** is considering how best to engage with General Practice Head of Departments around GP workforce crisis in both Australia and New Zealand. The subcommittee will also be coordinating a webinar for early 2023 – watch this space!

## **Upcoming Primary Care Opportunities**

#### International research funding opportunities

The NIHR Health Technology Assessment Programme in the UK has a long-standing collaboration with the Australian NHMRC and advertise joint commissioned calls inviting collaborative international research proposals to address shared research priorities. These collaborative commissioned calls are announced on

the <u>NIHR</u> and funding <u>NHMRC</u> websites. There is also opportunity to <u>suggest research</u> topics that could go through the NIHR prioritisation process for future funding consideration. Joint funding applications between the UK and Australia may be one way to provide opportunity and solidify international relationships in primary health care research.

Please contact the Secretariat if you have a research idea and we can put you in touch with the Society for Academic Primary Care (SAPC) in the UK who will assist with facilitating collaboration with NIHR.
